Date: October 31, 2013

From: Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR), Parry Sound District

The **MINISTRY OF NATURAL RESOURCES** Parry Sound District is advising area residents that high water levels in area rivers and lakes currently being experienced <u>could</u> reach flood levels in vulnerable flood-prone locations with precipitation forecasts of 50-60mm over the next three days.

The long range forecast is calling for additional rainfall accumulation of 30+mm into next week.

The Parry Sound District Ministry of Natural Resources is advising area residents to take action to protect infrastructure in flood prone areas and continue to exercise caution around water bodies and any low lying areas.

This message will be in effect until 5:00pm on Tuesday November 5, 2013 and will be updated before then should conditions change.

** FLOOD WATCH: potential for flooding exists within specific watercourses and municipalities
WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT: unsafe lake, river and channel conditions exist.
FLOOD WARNING: flooding is imminent or occurring within specific watercourses and municipalities.
